



Mediaguide - Guided tours

A detailed mediaguide is available in several foreign languages, as well as in a version for children, in German sign language, in plain language, and in a version for the visually impaired.

The „Beethoven-Haus Bonn“ app can also be downloaded free of charge from Google Play or the App Store and can be used on your own device.

Guided tours or introductions - for individual visitors, families, groups or school classes - can be booked in numerous languages (subject to a fee). Guided tours can also be arranged outside opening hours. Advance booking is required. For children, families and school classes there are special educational offers.

As part of guided tours, a concert in the music room on the historic fortepianos and/or a reading can also be booked.

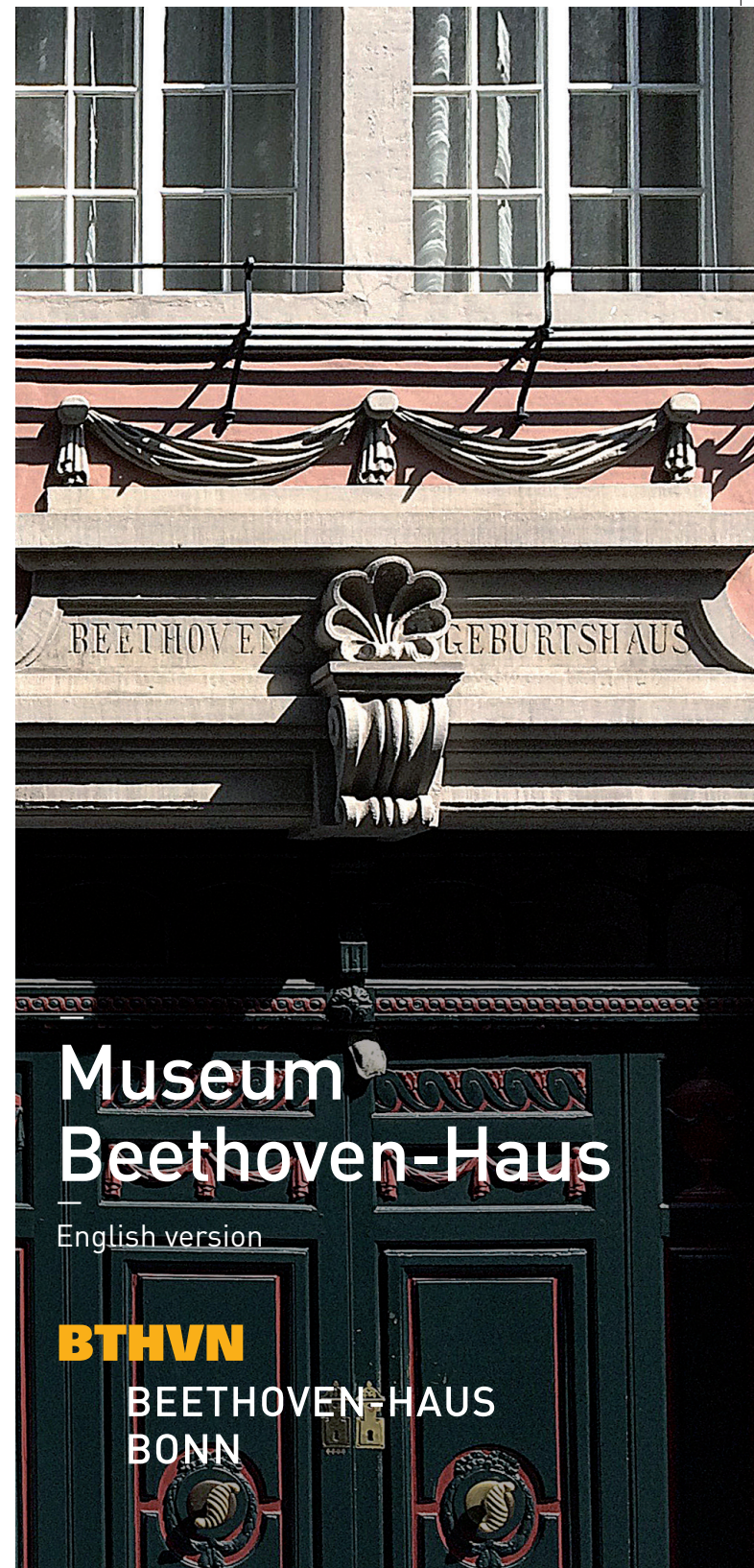

„.... my fatherland the beautiful region where I saw the light of day is still so beautiful and clear before my eyes since I left you, I will look upon this time as one of the happiest of my life, where I can see you again and greet our Father Rhine.“

Thus Ludwig van Beethoven writes to his friend Franz Gerhard Wegeler in 1801, reminiscing about his childhood and youth, which he spent in Bonn until he was 22.

Discover Beethoven

Beethoven's birthplace at Bonngasse 20 is one of the few 18th-century town houses in Bonn that has been preserved. The visitor enters through the historic hallway the courtyard with the old water pump and the small garden, and suddenly, in the midst of the hustle and bustle of the city, a peaceful and romantic atmosphere surrounds him.

Ludwig van Beethoven was born in the back house in December 1770. Today, it is a museum and is one of the most frequently visited musicians' museums in the world. Here visitors can discover Beethoven the man and artist. The museum rooms are spread over three floors, where you can explore the thematically structured exhibition by strolling. The topics range from Beethoven's roots in his hometown of Bonn, his regular everyday life as an artist, his social network of friends and patrons to the blow of his deafness. One room is devoted to his work, which transcends all conventions. Several media and artistic stagings open up new perspectives on the historical documents and objects and invite visitors to a modern contemporary encounter with Beethoven.

The Beethoven-Haus is home to the largest and most diverse Beethoven collection worldwide. Numerous particularly impressive objects from it are on display in the museum: the organ console, for example, at which Beethoven made music as a child, Beethoven's desk and the fortepiano he last owned in Vienna, or the ear trumpets that were made especially for him, and of course numerous music manuscripts, letters and portraits.

A highlight is a visit to the „treasure chamber“ in the historic vaulted cellar. Here a special selection of original Beethoven manuscripts. The daylight-free room allows the presentation of exhibits that change on a regular basis and illustrate Beethoven's writing and working processes.

under ever new aspects

Temporary special exhibitions and special events which take a closer look at Beethoven's life and work and his aftermath from different aspects, make a visit to the Beethoven-Haus a rewarding experience.

and with lots of music

Regularly there is also „music as in Beethoven's time“: On selected days, young pianists give concerts on the historic fortepianos in the museum's music room. The neighbouring chamber music hall also hosts top-class concerts with internationally renowned artists.
